
MOTION TO PROCEED ON APPEAL IN FORMA PAUPERIS

7. Nunley does not have any stocks, bonds, real estate, or other assets that he could liquidate to pay the costs associated with this appeal.


WEREFORE, Nunley prays that this court will grant this motion and allow him to proceed on appeal without pre-payment of fees and all other relief deemed just and appropriate.


